New inbound service, "THE TOKYO PASS" One admission pass for 39 cultural attractions in Tokyo + Unlimited subway rides!



This service is designed to enhance the cultural tourism experience of foreign visitors to Tokyo. The pass includes admissions to 39 public and private museums, art museums, gardens, zoos, aquariums, botanical gardens and other cultural attractions. A Tokyo Subway Ticket, which offers unlimited rides on all Tokyo subways, can be purchased as an added option and makes the touring of Tokyo's cultural attractions a breeze. Users can purchase the pass online and enter the facilities using the QR code on THE TOKYO PASS app. Within the app, users can also learn about Tokyo neighborhoods through curated area guides and connect with the people in the various areas around each cultural facility.

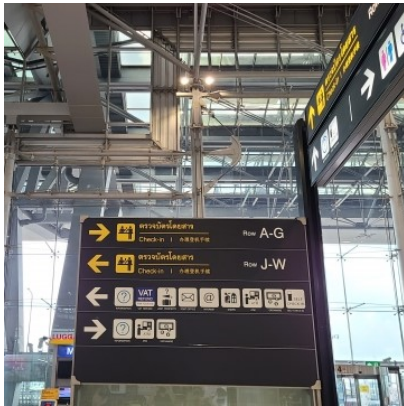
teamLab Borderless to Close Ahead of Central Tokyo Move
Museum set to reopen as part of the Toranomon-Azabudai Project to be completed in 2023, becoming even more borderless.

teamLab Borderless: MORI Building DIGITAL ART MUSEUM in Tokyo closed on August 31 ahead of its relocation to new premises. It has been based in Odaiba in Tokyo Bay since 2018, but is set to move to central Tokyo as part of the Toranomon-Azabudai Project, slated to



be completed in 2023. The new museum will unveil works by art collective teamLab that further explore the concept, “wander, explore, discover in one borderless world.” Not all is lost in the Odaiba venue: You can visit Vegan Ramen Uzu and the Flower Shop without an entry ticket, and there’s a digital monolith outside the museum which you can enjoy for free until the end of 2023.

Japan's new border rules for international travellers starting September 7th

- Independent tourists can now travel to Japan without being in a guided group tour. However, they are required to book their flights and accommodation through a travel agency.
- Pre-arrival Covid-19 tests are no longer needed for fully vaccinated travellers (including a booster shot).
- Travellers still need to apply for a visa.
- FITs and backpackers are still not allowed to enter the country for tourism purposes.
- The entry limit into Japan is now 50,000 people per day.
